Over the last five years, Grundy Art Gallery in Blackpool has developed a special interest in artists who use light as a material within their work. In addition to an annual light themed exhibition each autumn, Grundy has also been adding light based art works to its collection.

New life in an old building

Until 31 May

Preparations continue to celebrate the reopening of the Old Library later in 2025. This exhibition acts as a taster before we reopen the doors, giving an insight into the work that has been carried out to restore the building to its former glory. The displays feature a series of specially commissioned images by photographer Ingrid Turner capturing the stories of those who have contributed to this restoration work.

A new chapter will begin as the building becomes home to civic functions such as the Mayor's Parlour and Council Chamber. It will also contain studio spaces for the creativity of Oldham Theatre Workshop's young people to flourish. And on the second floor one of the original art gallery spaces will be beautifully restored.

Take a look back and explore the history of this building which has served the local community since 1883. It is a place where many Oldhamers attended their first exhibition or borrowed their first library book. We'd love to hear, and share, your memories too.

Bird Photographer of the Year

14 June – 6 September

This stunning exhibition showcases the work of photographers capturing the beauty and diversity of birdlife. Winning images have been chosen from thousands of entries in eight categories including Bird Portraits, Birds in Flight and Urban Birds. There are also three junior categories encouraging young people to connect with nature through photography.

This exhibition has conservation at its heart, working closely with Birds on the Brink charity, who provide funding for conservation projects all over the world. The overall winning entry is an impactful image of 4000 birds that have collided with high-rise buildings in Toronto.

Whatever your interest in either photography or birds there will be something to amaze or inspire you in this thought-provoking exhibition.

Indian Perspectives by Tony Philips and Jasmir Creed

27 September – 3 January 2026

Indian Perspectives examines the legacies of British colonial rule of India and the experiences of people of Indian heritage living in Britain. It features more than 100 drawings and paintings.

Liverpool-born artist Tony Phillips uses his characteristic socially engaged drawings to look at the impact British colonial rule had on India and its people. He explores the cross-fertilisation of cultures ensuing from post-Independence Indian migration to Britain. Meanwhile, Jasmir Creed's oil paintings draw on her Anglo-Indian heritage to create large colourful paintings reflecting on issues around identity.

10 May – 26 July Steeped in contrasts between movement and stillness, Pedestrian is a retrospective of textile-based works by artist/maker



Émma Blackburn. Her work explores relationships and family history through opposing materials: hard and soft sculpture, striking colours, pressed flowers, basic shapes, and reflective surfaces.

Palettes to Spray Cans by Bill Eiffert, Deggy, Dylan Lisle 2 August – 18 October

This group exhibition from members of 1853 Studios, explores the evolution of painting from the 16th century Renaissance through to contemporary pop culture

and street art. By presenting works from these diverse periods side by side, the exhibition invites viewers to trace the progression of artistic thought, technique, and cultural influence over five centuries.
